

Knowledge Organiser: Year 1 Science – Autumn 2 – v4 2023



Children will know:

Animals including Humans 1-6

- Identify, name, draw and label basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals including pets).
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

Prior Learning Links:

EYFS – Nursery F1

- Talk about some of the things they have observed and begin to use the correct vocabulary.
- Understand that some animals have similar features.
- Comments and asks questions about aspects of the natural world.

EYFS - Reception F2

- Shows care and concern for living things and the environment.
- Use new knowledge to classify animals and therefore highlight their similarities.
- Answers and asks 'why?' questions.
- Records observations in a number of ways, drawing, written work, photographs.

- Observe features of the human body.
- Carry out simple tests to compare and classify.
- Make predictions when using the senses.
- Ask questions to identify, sort and classify.
- Make comparisons between animals and give reasons.
